UPDATE #2: April 1, 2024

Roderick Hudson was convicted and sentenced today for shooting three people in 2022. On March 26, 2022, Mr. Hudson shot three teenage victims in the City Parking Garage, seriously injuring one via a gunshot wound to the stomach. The court sentenced him to a minimum of 4 years and a max of 15 years. He will get credit for two years of time served.

UPDATE: to prior press release

After a release of the suspect's photo, Roderick Hudson (DOB: 05/23/1999) of South Burlington retained an attorney and surrendered himself to the Burlington Police Department. He is being held without bail and will be arraigned on 03/31/2022. His current charges include Attempted 2nd Degree Homicide, 2 counts of Aggravated Assault with a Deadly Weapon, and 2 counts of Reckless Endangerment. One shooting victim is still in the hospital recovering.

UPDATE to previous press release from the morning of 3-26-22

The Burlington Police Department is seeking the public's help in identifying the suspect of the early morning shooting at the Marketplace Parking Garage in Burlington. The attached photos are of the suspect, who was among a larger group when the shooting occurred.

There were three victims of the shooting, one of which was treated and released from the hospital with non-life threatening injuries, while the other remains hospitalized in stable condition. Another male received a minor wound from shrapnel and declined medical treatment.
