





PERCENT OF POPULATION AGE 65+










What Americans want in housing as they age

- <75%: More than 3/4 of people age 50+ want to remain in their home or community.</p>
- >50%: Fewer than half believe they will stay in their homes
- <60%: Over 60 percent of all adults own their own homes
- **33%:** One-third report **major modifications are needed** to accommodate aging.



- 50%: Half of adults already share or would be willing to share a home as they age,
- **7%:** Only about 7% of survey respondents have an ADU.
- 33%: One-third would be interested in building one
