To vote:

- Use **BLACK** Pen to fill in the ovals. **DO NOT USE PENCIL.**
- Completely fill in the oval in the 1st column for your 1st choice candidate.
- Optionally fill in the oval in the 2nd column for your 2nd choice candidate.
- Continue to rank as many or as few of the candidates as you would like.
- To rank a write-in candidate, write the person's name in the write-in space and fill in the oval for the ranking of your choice. Please use block letters and stay within the box provided for write-ins.
- **Fill in no more than one oval for each row and and one oval for each column.**
- **Do not skip rankings.** For example, do not fill in 1st and 3rd choices without filling in a 2nd choice.
- If you make a mistake, tear, or deface the ballot, return it to an election official and obtain another ballot. **DO NOT ERASE.**

2. INCREASE IN PUBLIC SAFETY TAX RATE FOR FIRE AND POLICE PURPOSES
