

INVITATION FOR BIDS
FLOOD DAMAGE REPAIR NORTH OF STARR FARM ROAD
CITY OF BURLINGTON RECREATION PATH
City of Burlington Department of Public Works

Sealed Bids from pre-qualified contractors will be accepted until 1:00 p.m. prevailing time on Friday, October 12, 2012 at the City of Burlington Department of Public Works office located at 645 Pine Street in Burlington. Bid opening will occur immediately after the bid submittal deadline. Sealed Bids shall be marked "Bid Documents - Burlington Recreation Path Flood Damage Repair North of Starr Farm Road".

Each Bid must be accompanied by a certified check payable to the City of Burlington for five percent (5%) of the total amount of the Bid. A bid bond may be used in lieu of a certified check.

The construction includes removing unsuitable soils and vegetation, supplying & installing new armor stone, crushed stone subbase and pavement to repair flood damage along the recreation path, and all incidentals to make the Work conform with the Contract Documents and make the job complete.

The slope stabilization component of the Contract shall be substantially complete by December 31, 2012. Notice to Proceed will be issued by November 1, 2012. The remainder of the path restoration and paving will be completed by May 17, 2013.
