**NARRATIVE:**

On January 09, 2022 at approximately 2155 hours, Burlington Police responded to 595 Shelburne Rd for a reported stolen vehicle.

Officer arrived on scene and met with the victim who had left their keys in the vehicle by accident. The victim returned to the vehicle a short time later to find the vehicle missing. The victim's cell phone, wallet, and significant amount of work equipment was inside the vehicle.

On January 12, 2022, Essex Police Department located the vehicle in the area of 27 Susie Wilson Rd. Surveillance footage was obtained from the Property Management which revealed an unknown female operating the vehicle on multiple occasions after the vehicle was reported stolen.

The Burlington Police Department is asking the public's help in identifying the female in the attached photo. The Burlington Police Department also wants to remind the public to lock their vehicle and do not leave them unattended if the vehicle is left idling.
