PLEASE TAKE NOTE that City of Burlington Department of Parks Recreation and Waterfront has submitted a corrective action plan ("CAP") to the Vermont Department of Environmental Conservation for the Burlington Bike Path Project, in order to rehabilitate the bike path and associated features in downtown Burlington, Vermont. The project area includes the northern end of Waterfront Park, the Urban Reserve, and the area located between the Urban Reserve and North Beach.

The purpose of the CAP is to specify the procedures for the handling of contaminated soil and media that may be encountered during bike path construction work, due to historic industrial uses of the site. The CAP is intended to ensure that identified contaminants within the Project area do not present a risk to the environment, sensitive receptors, or the public during construction activities and during future Bike Path use.

In general, the bike path will be realigned, and widened to accommodate additional pedestrian and bicycle traffic. In the Urban Reserve, the bike path will be realigned to parallel the Lake Champlain shoreline, several relict concrete and asphalt surfaces will be removed, the dog park fence will be upgraded, and the area will be planted with trees. Minor adjustments to the bike path will occur in the northern end of Waterfront Park and between the Urban Reserve and North Beach. Project construction will involve shallow excavation and earthwork during the preliminary construction activities. Construction of the project is anticipated to occur from the Summer 2016 construction season through the Summer 2017 construction season.

Full copies of the corrective action plan and design plans may be viewed at the City of Burlington Clerk's Office and the Vermont Waste Management & Prevention Division Office in Montpelier, Vermont. A public comment period is open for 15 days (closing on April 29, 2016). Comments shall be directed to the Waste Management & Prevention Division at the addresses below:
