

## Burlington City Center Sidewalk Stencils

### WHY?

- Pedestrian safety on sidewalks was identified as a concern at the 2006 Burlington Pedestrian Summit as well as in the 2007 AARP Vermont Burlington Livable Community Project.
- The new stenciling will improve pedestrian safety by giving bicyclists a friendly reminder of bicycle rules in the City Center—and that sidewalks are for walking.

### WHERE?

- Riding bicycles is not permitted on sidewalks within the City Center, an 8 square block area around Church St. bounded by Pearl St., South Winooski Ave., Main St., and St. Paul St.

### WHO?

- The Burlington Walking Work Group ([www.burlingtonwalks.org](http://www.burlingtonwalks.org)) is a voluntary citizens group that meets monthly to discuss pedestrian issues. It provides feedback on transportation plans, supports neighborhood walks, and strives to make Burlington a safer and friendlier walking city. They meet the 2nd Monday of every month at the CCAN offices at 125 College Street, 2nd Floor.
- The Burlington Bicycle Council ([www.burlingtonbicyclecouncil.org](http://www.burlingtonbicyclecouncil.org)) is a citizen's advocacy organization that promotes the safe use of bicycles throughout the city. They meet the first Wednesday of the month at 5:30 at Burlington DPW, 645 Pine St.
- Place Creative donated their services to create the distinctive stencil designs, with help from Local Motion.
- The stencils and paint are provided by the City of Burlington Department of Public Works.
