Quarterly Report
Third Quarter 2016

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Summary

Quarter Three

Both calls for service and offenses known to police were at five-year lows during quarter three of 2016. In terms of offenses, total crimes known to police were down 7% compared to the third quarter of 2015 and down 11% compared to the third-quarter average for 2012-2015, the latter being a statistically significant decrease. This decline was largely produced by a decrease in property crimes. Property related offenses during this quarter saw an 18% decrease since last year and a 22% decrease compared to the four-year quarter-three average. While violent offenses remained relatively stable overall, simple assaults experienced a meaningful decline - about 30% - compared to last year. Drug offenses were the exception. Drug-related offenses increased a significant amount since quarter three of 2015 – about 62%. Heroin-related offenses were the driving force behind this increase. Reaching a 5-year high, heroin incidents in quarter-three of this year were 127% greater than the four-year average in terms of volume.

Calls for service overall were down 15% during quarter three of 2016 compared to quarter three of 2015 and down 14% compared to the four-year average, both statistically significant decreases large enough to consider quarter three of 2016 an outlier. An impressive decrease in quality of life calls – down 16% since last year and 12% compared to the four-year average – are largely the reason for the decrease overall. Both noise calls and ordinance violation calls dipped to five-year lows and were 32% and 19% lower than quarter three of 2015 and the four-year average respectively. Violent crime calls for service were down significantly from last year – 26% - but was on par with the four-year average. Property crime calls for service were significantly lower than the four-year average-19%, largely driven by the 45% drop in Larcenies (other) from last year and 47% decrease compared to the four-year average. The exception is Larcenies from motor vehicles which, after seeing an unprecedented drop during quarter three of last year, returned to around their four-year average.

Year-to-Date

Year-to-date, calls for service are down significantly since last year and compared to the year-to-date average for 2012-2015. Violent crime calls for service are up slightly in 2016 compared to the average, but down slightly from last year. The largest increase was for domestic assault misdemeanors – up 37% compared to the four-year average- however, domestic assault calls for service dropped during quarter three of 2016. Property crime calls are down significantly in 2016 compared to the four-year average – 10%. The largest decrease has been for Larcenies (other) – 33%, but this decrease has nearly been matched by an equally significant 31% increase in retail thefts compared to the four-year average. This may be a reflection of a change in policy on how these incidents are being recorded rather than demonstrated public behaviors. Quality of life calls are also down significantly year-to-date since last year – 13% - and compared to the four-year average – 9%. Domestic disturbances and noise complaints are down 22% and 25% respectively compared to their four-year averages. Disorderly conduct, ordinance violations and trespasses are down 26%, 22%, and 17% respectively since last year. The exceptions are mental health issues and overdoses, which are up significantly compared to the four-year average – 15% and 65% respectively – but are not up considerably since last year.



Offense Groups by Year - Q3







Calls for Service Groups by Year - Q3







Aggravated and Simple Assault


There were 9 aggravated assaults and 57 simple assaults during this period. This is a decrease since last year and compared to the average. Overall, both simple assaults and aggravated assaults have remained relatively stable since 2012.

Ten (15%) incidents were mental health related, 23 (35%) were alcohol related, and 6 (10%) were drug related.



Seventy-four percent of assaults occur between 18:00–06:00. Aggravated Assaults were concentrated mostly around the Main St. city center, while the simple assaults spread throughout the downtown area and into the Old North End, Hill Section and E Area.



Domestic Violence

There were 38 domestic assaults and 153 domestic disturbances during this period. Domestic assaults were down compared to last year but on par with the average. Domestic disturbances were on par with last year but down compared to the average. 


Domestic Assaults/Disturbances by Day of Week and Time of Day

Domestic Assault Total




Robbery

There were 8 robberies during this period, down 2 from last year and 1.5 from the four-year average. Year to date there are 5 fewer robberies than last year and 2 fewer than the four-year average. Although robberies were down this quarter, the trend since 2012 is slightly upward.





Burglary

There were 73 burglaries during this period, down by 24% from from last year and 26% from the four-year average. Year to date, burglaries are down significantly (21%) from last year and from the four-year average (29%). Thirty three (45%) of the burglaries were forced entry through doors or windows, and sixty-six were residential. The most commonly stolen property includes electronics, specifically computers and video game consoles. Cash, bicycles and jewelry were also commonly stolen items.





Larceny from Motor Vehicle



Just 24% were forced entry while the remainder showed no forced entry or the doors were known to be unsecured. Most of these incidents were reported in the mornings or evenings.


Larceny from Building, Person or Other

There were 101 Larcenies from buildings, down from 2015 and the three-year average, but not significantly. Year to date, larcenies from buildings are also down from 2015 and the average. Larcenies from a person are down similarly. Larcenies from other areas were down significantly both from last year (45%) and compared to the average (47%). Further, these calls are down 33% year-to-date from the average. These are all statistically significant decreases.






There were twenty stolen vehicle calls during this period, eight more than last year but just two more than the four-year average. Year to date, calls for stolen vehicles are up from last year but on par with the average. In all seven cases, vehicles were stolen from the owner’s residence, in six they were stolen while parked on the street, and in four they were stolen from a parking lot or garage.



Vandalism

There were 143 vandalism calls for service during this period, up slightly from 2015 but below the average. Year to date there have been 373 vandalism calls, 20% more than 2015. This is a meaningful increase. However, year-to-date, vandalism calls are below the average. The noise in vandalism calls this year is a contrast to the long-term downward trend in vandalism calls.


In July there was a vandalism pattern involving a subject or subjects shooting out the windows of vehicles with a BB gun or pellet gun. The incidents stopped in late July before returning in late September. So far, out of the 25 incidents, no projectiles have been recovered. However, suspect vehicles have been captured on camera.



Disorderly Conduct

There were 65 disorderly conducts calls for service during this period. This is a statistically significant decrease since the 95 that occurred last year. It is also below the four-year average. Year to date, there have been 148 disorderly conduct calls, down 26% from 2015 and 17% from the three-year average, both statistically significant drops. While July and August were unusually low in terms of volume, disorderly conduct calls spiked in September to resemble the normal seasonal pattern.






Intoxication


The vast majority of calls occur in the downtown with a large number of calls also originating at UVM/MC.


Mental Health

There were 201 mental health calls during this period. That is an 18% decrease from last year but a slight increase compared to the average. Year to date there have been 588 mental health calls, down 53 (8%) from 2015 but up 76 (15%) from the four-year average, a significant increase. There is a steady upward trend going back to 2012, but there seems to be some evidence of a tapering off in the number of calls.




While the majority of calls occur downtown there is also a density of calls occurring in the area of Flynn Ave and Pine St.


Noise

There were 320 noise calls for service during this period, down 21% from 2015 and down 32% from the four-year average, both significant decreases. Year to date there have been 824 noise calls for service, down 8% from 2015 and down 25% from the four-year average, the latter being a statistically significant decrease. There is a steady downward trend in noise related calls from 2012, that has continued in 2016.





Ordinance Violation





Overdose

There were 22 overdoses reported to BPD during this period, down 2 (8%) from 2015 but up 11 (96%) from the four-year average, the latter a significant increase. Year to date there have been 54 Overdoses reported to BPD, down 4 (7%) from 2015 but up 21 (65%) from the four-year average, the latter a significant increases.



For the past two years, calls for overdoses have shown very exaggerated seasonal trends with large spikes in volume during the summer months. The most common drug leading to overdose was heroin. Other overdoses included lorazepam and unreported prescription.



Trespass

There were 383 trespass calls for service during this period, down 9% from 2015 and 5% from the four-year average. Year to date there have been 894 trespass calls for service, down 17% from 2015 and down 5% from the four-year average, the former a statistically significant decrease.



18% of trespasses were residential in nature followed by convenience stores (10%) and Restaurants/Bars (8%).
